The Asuka Satoyama Club was formed to preserve the beauty of the Asuka Historical National Government Park. The Satoyama Club accepts applications for members once every year and, during their first year, the club offers a course of 20 lectures by experts in the field to provide the opportunity to study the rich history, culture, geology and natural history of the Asuka Satoyama region. During the second year, members take advantage of these studies as they take part in activities related to forest development, including events and guide activities, etc. In order to promote even higher levels of involvement we

will continue to conduct research and hold training sessions.

The Asuka area was the origin of a centralized government in ancient times, and it has a valuable historical heritage, as well as beautiful scenery. This 59.9 ha park, 15 times the size of the Koshien National Government Park Baseball Park, was created to preserve these assets.
